1 Background

- 1.1 The Annual Meeting of Council appointed Councillor Alan Caine as the West Lindsey District Council representative on the Lincolnshire Police and Crime Panel. Following the election of the Police and Crime Commissioner on 15 November 2012, Councillor Caine has stepped down from the position as being a personal friend of the newly elected Commissioner.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution, paragraph 7, Part IV, page 25, states that the Chief Executive approves appointments to organisations where vacancies exist following the Annual meeting of Council.
- 1.3 In order for West Lindsey District Councillor attendance to be at the inaugural meeting of the Panel on 27 November 2012, a Chief Executive delegated decision was taken to appoint Councillor Anne Welburn to the position in the interim.
