Whilst it has been announced LCC have received additional funding from Central Government, there will still be changes and possible reductions to transport services.</p> <p>Whilst we await more detailed information it is difficult to what services or areas of the District may need additional support. With further information we will be better able to determine how best to use the majority of our funds.
