# Background

The Regulatory Committee at its Meeting on 4 June 2020, resolved that: -

- a) the Council consult upon the discharge of the PSPO at Trinity Arts Centre; and
- b) subject to the results of the consultation, the decision on discharging the PSPO be delegated to the Chief Executive in conjunction with the Chairman of the Regulatory Committee.

### Notes relevant to decision

That consultation has now been undertaken and no responses were received, nor additional evidence provided to suggest that the PSPO should not be discharged. The normal statutory consultees were contacted and other than initial responses from the Police, only the ward councillors provided comments in a meeting with the relevant officers.

These comments have been summarised and sent back to ward members as part of the process and remain on file.

On that basis, it is proposed that the PSPO now be discharged and as a result will cease to have an effect from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2020.
