This review application relates to the premises known as WHITE HART HOTEL, which is a front room, bar and restaurant situated in the centre of Gainsborough. It has the benefit of a premises licence authorising the sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises from 10am to 2:00am Thursday - Saturday and live and recorded music from 9am until 2am from Thursday - Saturday. The premises opening hours are 7am to 1am Monday – Wednesday, 7am – 3am Thursday – Saturday and Sunday 7am – 12:30am.

Sharon Hopkinson is the premise licence holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor.

This review application is submitted as being relevant to the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and public safety.

Revised Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003

2.1 Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime and disorder

2.7 Licence Holders have a responsibility to ensure the safety of those using their premises, as part of their duties under the 2003 Act.

11.24 A number of reviews may arise in connection with crime that is not directly

connected with licensable activities....Licensing authorities do not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. This is the matter for the courts. The licensing authority's role when determining such a review is not therefore to establish guilt or innocence of any individual but to ensure the promotion of the crime prevention objective.

11.26 ....The licensing authority's duty is to take steps with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives in the interest of the wider community and not those of the individual licence holder.

Sharon HOPKINSON presents as an experienced licence holder with 25 years' experience, she is familiar with licensing conditions and the requirement to comply with those conditions on her licence. She is both licence holder and DPS. Hopkinson applied for the licence for the White Hart Hotel on 13<sup>th</sup> April 2015.

Following a series of incidents and concerns at how The White Hart Hotel was operating an application for a review of the premises licence was submitted and the hearing held on 12<sup>th</sup> May 2016. After hearing all the evidence the Alcohol Licensing Sub –Committee made the decision to revoke the premises licence.

Hopkinson appealed this decision and the appeal was heard at Lincoln Magistrate's court. On the courts advice through mediation, amended conditions were placed on the licence for the White Hart, a consent order through the court was agreed with regards to this and the premises licence restored. Lincolnshire Police also believe that the licensing consultancy firm Licensing Matters worked with Hopkinson during this period to ensure she possessed the necessary training, skills and tools required to promote the Licensing Objectives whilst responsibly running a safe licensed premises.

Local officers contacted the Alcohol Licensing Team at Lincolnshire Police in 2017 with concerns with how the White Hart Hotel was operating. Amongst the concerns was the fact that the premises licence condition "no bottles and glass to be taken from the premises when patrons leave the premise" had been breached on numerous occasions. Hopkinson was first made aware of this problem during a telephone conversation with Sgt 1040 Enderby on 17<sup>th</sup> May 2017. It was hoped having the concerns pointed out to her would result in immediate action to prevent glasses being taken out of the venue.

Lincolnshire Police have noticed a significant rise in serious assaults, which appear to centre on the White Hart Hotel in Gainsborough. Lincolnshire Police have gathered CCTV footage of numerous incidents recording breaches of the licence conditions and crime and disorder, centring around and from the premises. These date from 7<sup>th</sup> October 2017 to the present time. The CCTV which will be

played at the hearing will display serious assaults, relating to serious injuries. Large scale brawls, on a number of different days, persons displaying unacceptable level of drunkenness. During these incidents neither Hopkinson nor the staff appear to have any level of control of either the incidents or their aftermath. No visible steps or intervention has been witnessed by Hopkinson or anyone connected to The White Hart Hotel following these incidents in order to prevent a reoccurrence. What is witnessed clearly undermines the licensing objectives and demonstrates a lack of control at these licensed premises. Due to the sensitive nature of this CCTV footage Lincolnshire Police will be submitting it under Section 14 of the Licensing Hearings Regulations and request that all members of public be excluded whilst the footage is viewed.

The White Hart Hotel was visited on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2018, by officers from the Alcohol Licensing Team where a full licensing check was undertaken. Whilst at the premise officers also conducted tests of the venue with a drug itemiser. The readings taken showed high levels of cocaine in the ladies toilet cubicle and the gentleman's toilet sink area. Readings 4.94 and 5.78 respectively. The main bar front had a reading for cocaine of 2.54 (appendix 1).

During the visit officers also wanted to check the CCTV system for certain times and dates to look at incidents the police had attended. The licence states that "Recording **must** be kept for a minimum of 31 days and endorsed with the accurate, correct time/date (BST/GMT)". On the date of the visit the CCTV went back to Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2018. The recordings were kept for 22 days not the 31 days as specified in the licence, a breach of a licence condition.

An officer had a list of dates of incidents including the names of individuals involved, written down on a clip board she was holding (appendix 2). The officer intended to check the list against the premises CCTV System and incident book. Initially Hopkinson was unable to locate an incident book, despite this being a condition on the premises licence.

Eventually Hopkinson located an incident book; the last sheet was completed on 26/04/2017, 11 months previously. Lincolnshire Police seized this book and will produce it as evidence at the hearing. Hopkinson then appeared with a piece of paper headed '2018' and the address of the hotel. (appendix 3). She presented this to officers as her current "Incident Log and Barred List". This list had only 3 incidents recorded; these 3 incidents matched 3 of those written on the officer's list. Lincolnshire Police believe that Hopkinson hurriedly wrote this Incident Log, after viewing the officers list, in an attempt to persuade them that a log was being maintained.

The amount of incidents which had occurred in and around the premises were discussed with Hopkinson, she stated that she was going to employ 1 member of door security starting this coming weekend. Sharon was also asked to ensure that glasses were not leaving the pub, as police have numerous incidents and CCTV footage of patrons outside with glassware.

On occasions when incidents have happened within the White Hart both the victims and offenders have been allowed to leave the premises and no call was made to either police by any member of staff at the premises. Lincolnshire Police have major concerns that the premises are under reporting incidents occurring at the venue, whilst also failing to deal effectively with those incidents.

Lincolnshire Police have received 31 phone calls with regards to the White Hart between 4<sup>th</sup> December 2017 and 18<sup>th</sup> June 2018. Out of these calls only 4 calls were received from staff, 3 from Hopkinson reporting criminal damage or theft and 1 from a bar staff reporting a fight. This demonstrates a lack of due diligence from the premises (appendix 4) and further undermining of the licensing objectives of "the prevention of crime and disorder" and "public safety".

EMAS (East Midlands Ambulance Service) have been called to the premises 17 times in the last year, out of these 10 of the calls have been after 23:00 hours (appendix 5).

WLDC have published a CCTV monitoring form report for the period April 2017 – March 2018 (appendix 6). Page 5 of the report shows "public order & violence". The bottom graph shows Lord Street as having 52 incidents, this in comparison to Silver Street, with 3 pubs in close proximity that had only 21.

The other graph on the page shows the monthly trend. Lords Public House is permanently shut, and Xtra's was closed just before Christmas 2017 until it reopened on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018. This has left the White Hart as the only public house open on Lord Street for nearly 3 months of the reporting period. On Lords Street, Gainsborough we have 2 venues currently open. This evidence clearly shows the level

of incidents that have been observed by CCTV on Lords Street relating to Public Order and Violence.

On Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2018 01:51 an incident occurred within the premises, police attended the following morning, no staff were on duty who could work the CCTV system, they were told to come back at 16:00. Officers returned at 19:00, the bar staff were unable to work the CCTV and unable to review or provide footage. Hopkinson was not at the White Hart at this time. The officer left his contact number and stated he would return on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2018. Police returned and spoke with Hopkinson she had not copied the footage, and stated that she would copy it and drop it off at the police station. Part of the licence states "Recordings of incidents at the premises must be made secure for inspection by the police and provided immediately on demand. This means that a member of staff shall be on the premises at all times they are open to the public who is capable of operating the CCTV system and providing recordings on request". This is another breach of a condition on the premises licence. Breaches of the conditions on a premises licence are criminal offences under Section 136 of the Licensing Act.

Lincolnshire Police can think of no additional conditions that could be placed on the premises licence which are appropriate or which would prove effective for this licensed premises, due to the seriousness of the offences and the public disorder associated with the venue. Hopkinson has demonstrated a lack of control as both premises licence holder and DPS, she has regularly breached those conditions already embedded on her licence so there can be no confidence in her ability to manage additional conditions. She has had additional support, training and numerous police interventions, none of which have proved effective.

She refuses to accept that problems exist at the White Hart Hotel and has not demonstrated any ability to control this licensed premises or promote the licensing objectives. We feel that the revocation of the Premises Licence in this instance is the most appropriate course of action.

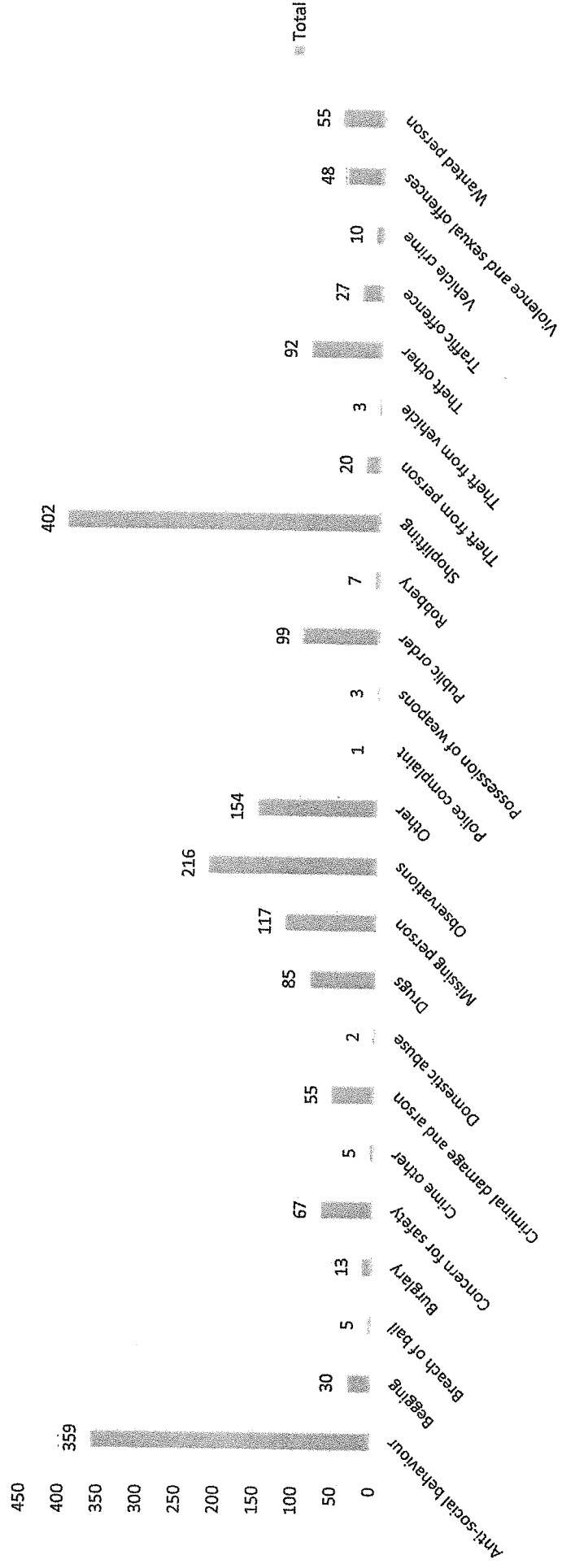

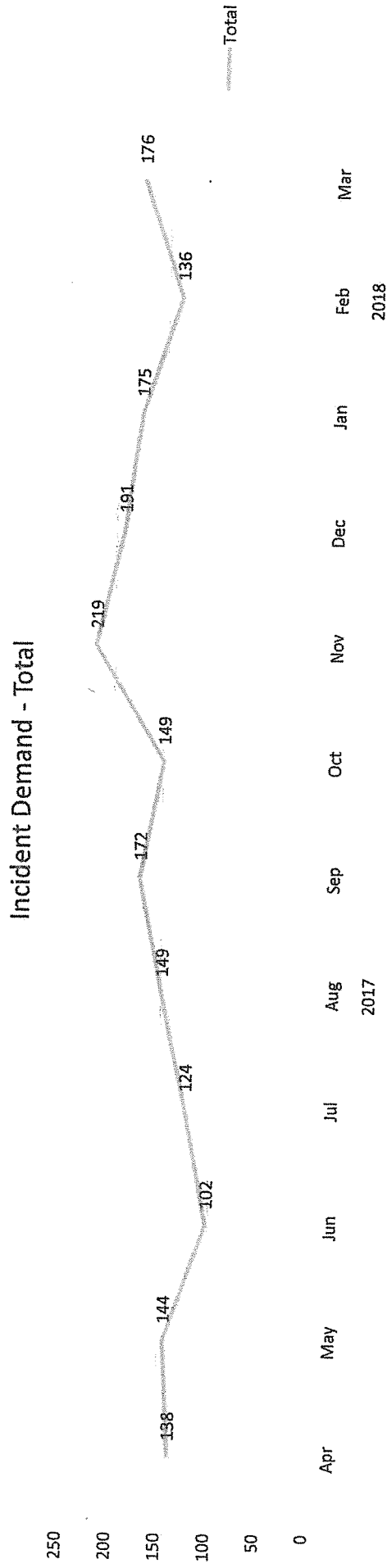

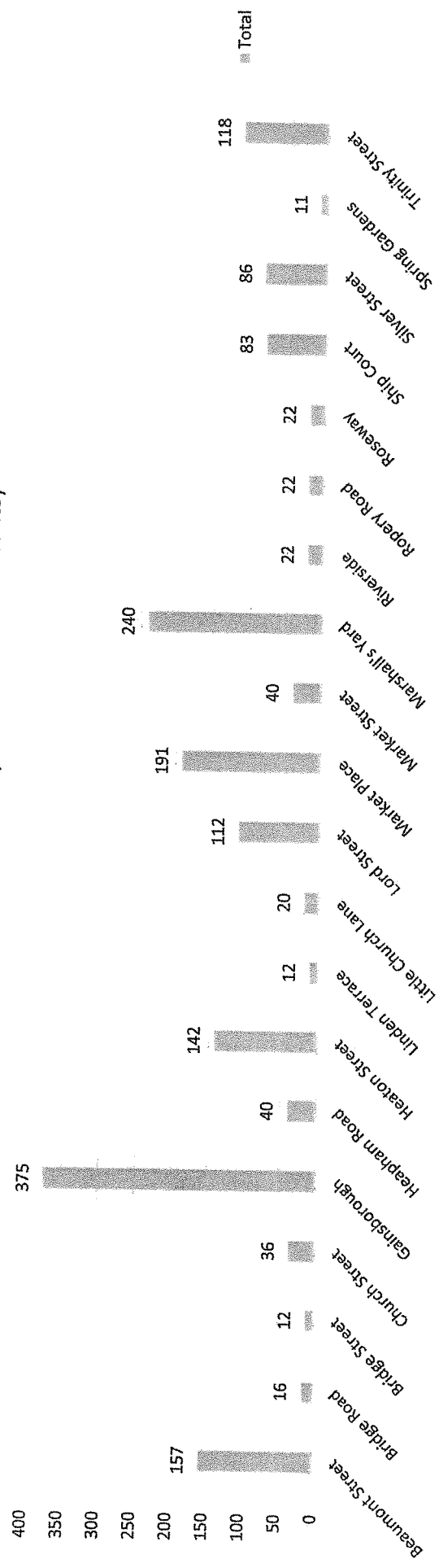
Type of Incidents - Total

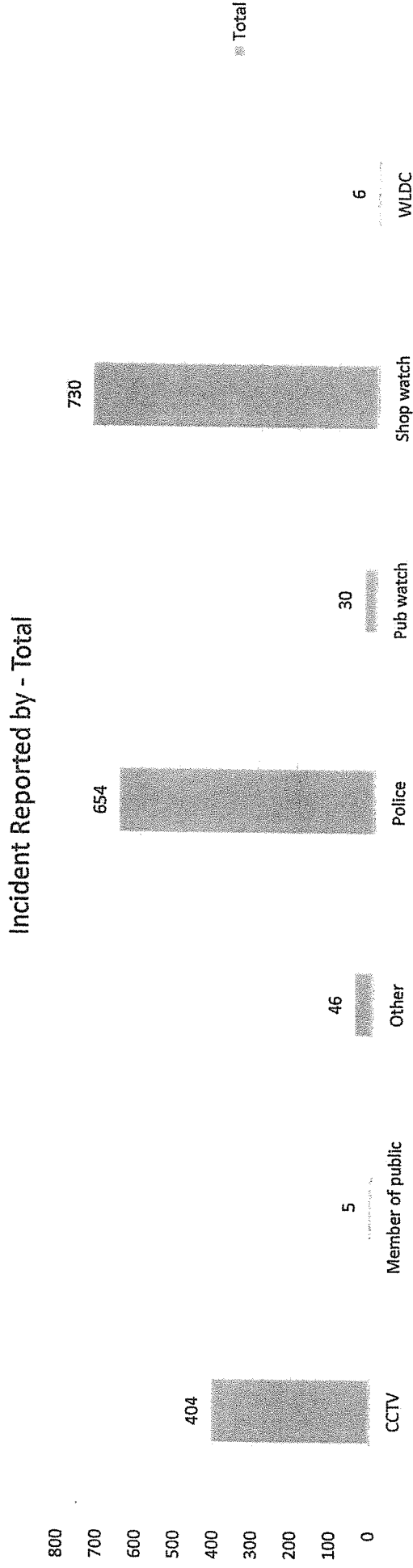


## Incident Locations - Total (More than 10 incidents)

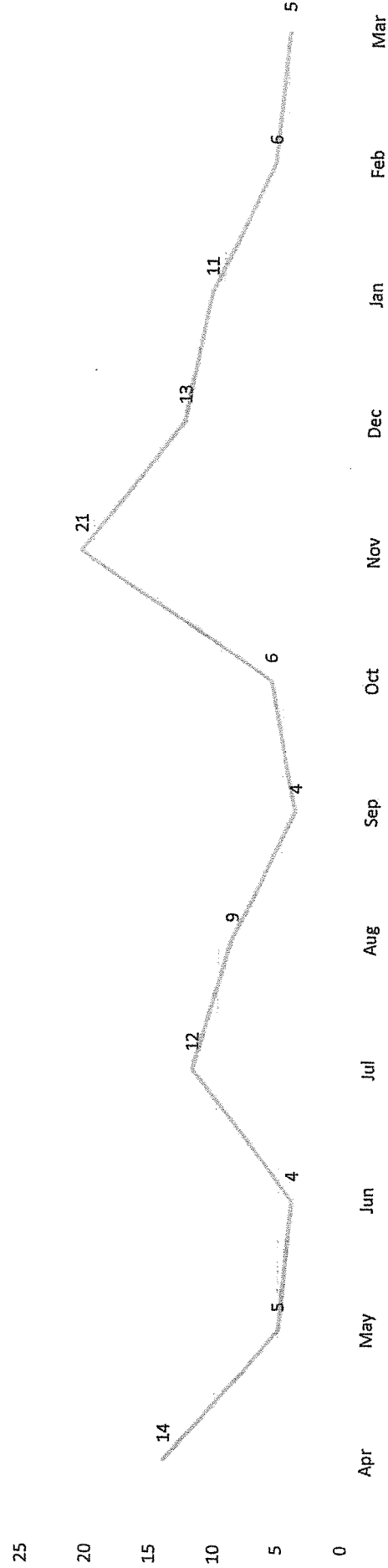




## Total Incidents

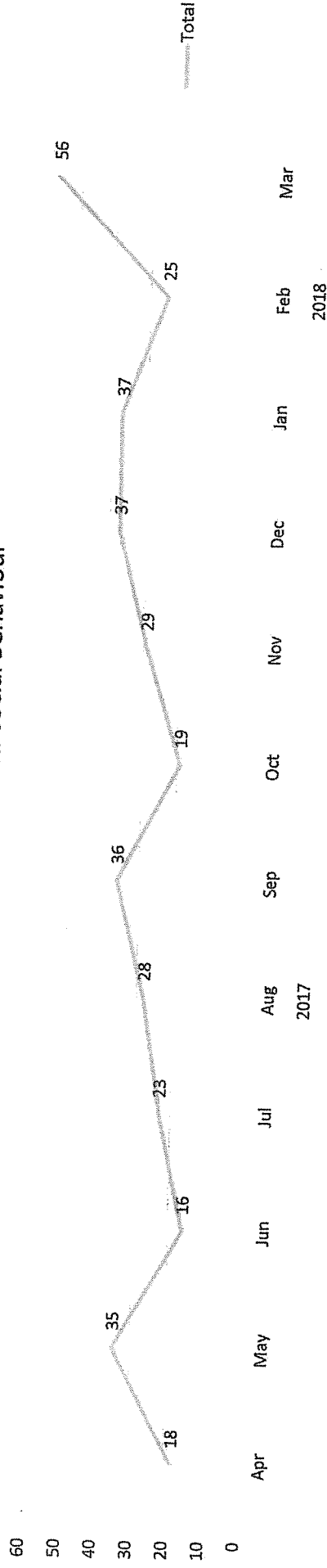


## Arrests Supported/Monitored Live - Total

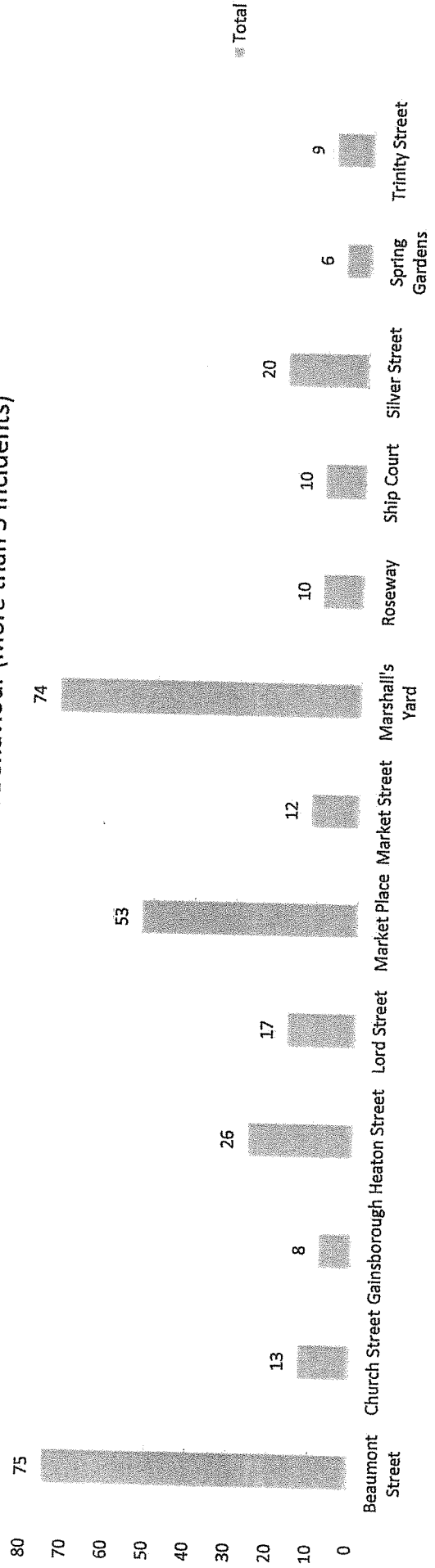


## Anti-social Behaviour

Incident Demand - Anti-social Behaviour

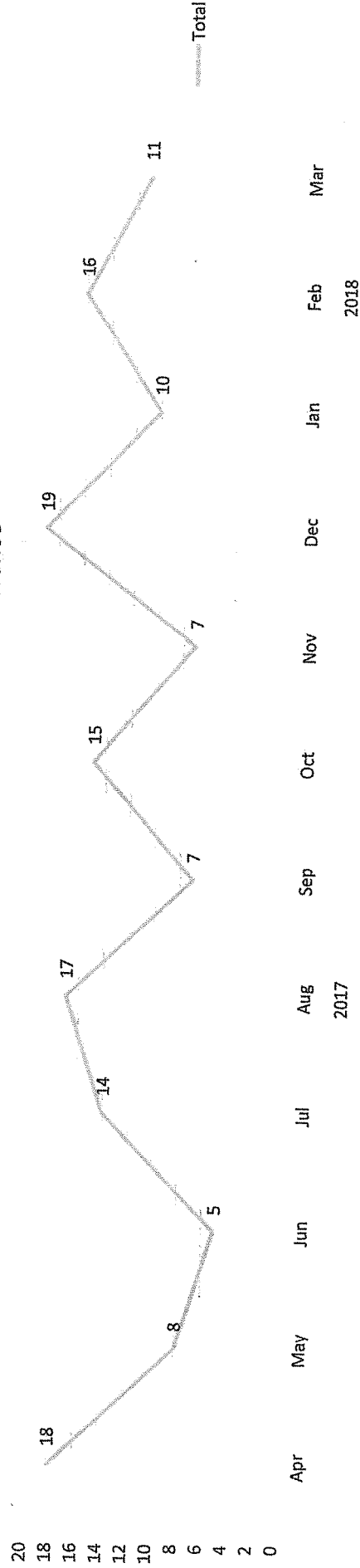


Incident Locations - Anti-social Behaviour (More than 5 incidents)

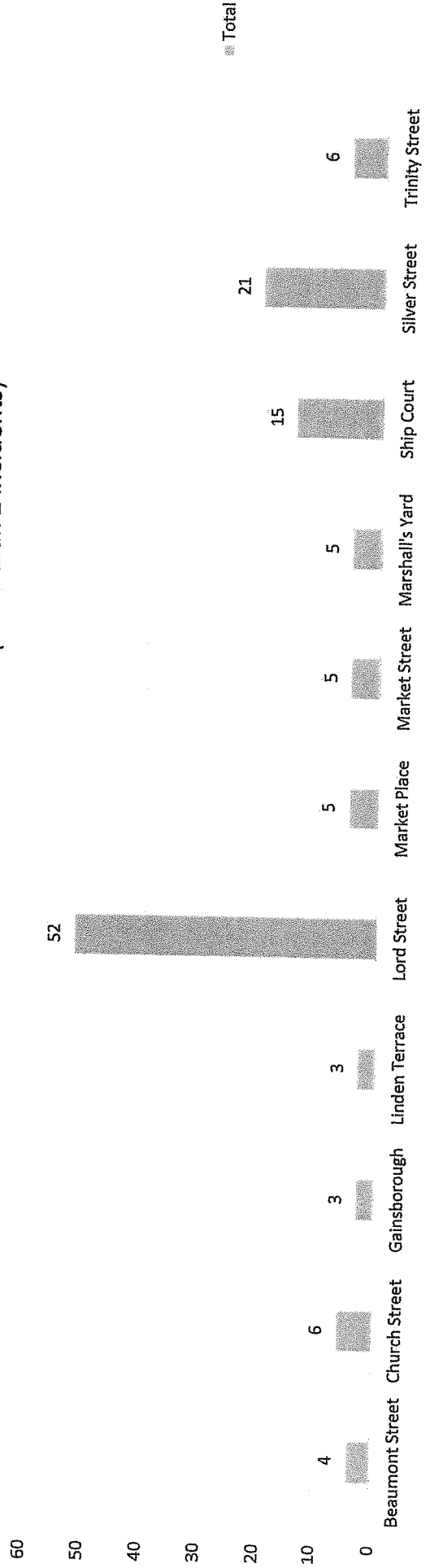


## Public Order & Violence

Incident Demand - Public Order & Violence

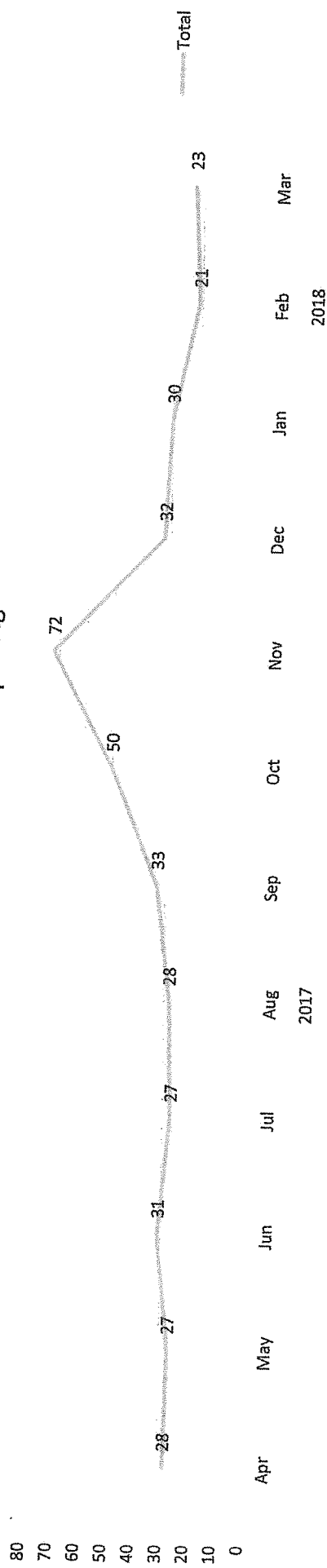


Incident Locations - Public Order & Violence (More than 2 incidents)

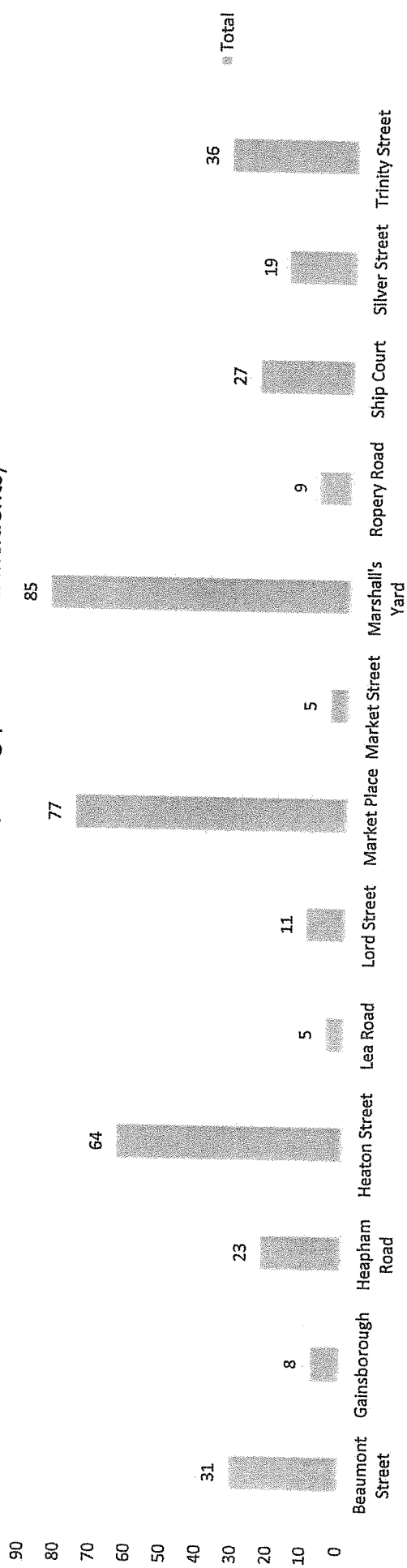


## Shoplifting

## Trend Analysis

Our reporting shows that frequency of certain types of incidents and crimes varied depending on the time of the year. Anti-social behaviour incidents increased during school holidays. We saw a sudden increase in anti-social behaviour during March 2018. Public order and violence offences were mostly linked to night time economy and peaked at key times during the year depending on bank holidays, festive periods and good weather. Shoplifting incidents experienced a significant increase during October and November in the lead up to Christmas.

A higher proportion of anti-social behaviour incidents occurred on Beaumont Street. Most had taken place near to McDonalds which is a popular meeting point and at the centre of a busy road and connecting key footpaths such as Pingle Hill. Another location with high volume of anti-social behaviour was Marshall's Yard which may have a higher record due to increased detections from security officers.

A much higher proportion of public order and violence incidents have occurred on Lord Street. There are 3 venues at this location as part of the night time economy. At this location The White Hart and Xtras attract the largest footfall during night time economy periods which resulted in a greatly increased level of demand during Friday and Saturday nights. Silver Street and Ship Court also contain a range of night time economy venues and see increased footfalls on Friday and Saturday nights.

A higher proportion of shoplifting incidents have occurred at Marshall's Yard which may have a higher record due to increased detections from security officers. High levels of shoplifting incidents were recorded at main town centre locations with the majority of stores being targeted.

### Notes:

1. Incident type 'Other' may relate to any other use of CCTV such as a subject access request.
2. Incidents with a location listed as a place/town name are where CCTV has been used across the entire area to search or monitor.
3. Number arrested is only recorded if the arrest is monitored live on CCTV. Many incidents may lead to arrests being made at a later time as a result of CCTV evidence and/or further investigation.
4. Recorded shoplifting incidents include all instances of shoplifting regardless of the final outcome. Our figures include shoplifting incidents where goods are retrieved, confirmed attempts to shoplift and shoplifting incidents that are not recorded as crimes by the Police. A shoplifting incident may not be recorded as a crime by the Police if goods are retrieved or stores do not complete a shoplifting pack within a certain time period.
